

GENERAL BSN PROGRAM

St. John's College in Springfield, IL offers a baccalaureate nursing degree (BSN) program for students who have completed 56 hours of pre-nursing courses at an accredited college or university with a grade point average of 2.75 or higher. All pre-nursing class requirements must be complete before entering St. John's College as the college offers only upper division nursing courses.

General Program Admission

Students who have completed 30 semester hours of lower division transferable college credit may apply for our general program. Application decisions begin November 15 of the year prior to enrolling. Students may choose to attend any accredited college or university to complete lower division pre-requisite courses. Pre-requisite guides for regionally accredited institutions are available at sjcs.edu.

Submission of minimum acceptance requirements does not guarantee acceptance into the program. While applications are accepted throughout the year, applicants are encouraged to apply early due to the competitiveness of acceptance.

Criteria for Provisional Acceptance


Applications for provisional acceptance are accepted while actively pursuing the required lower division credits. Consideration for provisional acceptance is based on the following requirements. (After 30 hours of designated lower division transferable college credit.):

- 1. Completed application accompanied by a \$60 non-refundable application fee.
- Submission of a legal document showing proof of name at time of application (state-issued photo ID).
- 3. Applicants are required to complete the ATI Test of Essential Academic Skills (ATI TEAS) with a minimum score of proficient.
- 4. Official transcripts at the end of each semester from all regionally accredited college(s) attended showing:
 - a. A minimum of 30 semester hours of designated lower division transferable college credit with a cumulative GPA of 2.75/4.0.
 - b. A minimum grade of C in all required courses completed. All science courses are required to be completed within the last five years prior to enrollment in St. John's College.
 Anatomy and physiology must be taken at the same institution.
 - c. No designated lower division course may be repeated more than once.
 - d. Official transcripts must come from the granting institution directly to St. John's College. Hand-carried transcripts are not acceptable.
- 5. Personal interview as requested by the college.
- 6. Two professional references.
- 7. Personal essay.
- 8. Good academic standing at the last institution attended.
- Proof of graduation from a high school approved by the State Board of Education via an official transcript or possession of a high school equivalency certificate verified by an official GED score report. Official transcripts should include ACT or SAT.
- 10. All applicants with English as a second language are required to take the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) and achieve a score of 560 on the paper version, 220 on the computer-based version or 83 on the internetbased (iBT) version.

ACCELERATED BSN PROGRAM

The Accelerated Pre-licensure
BSN program is for students who
have earned a baccalaureate
degree in another field of study.
Applicants must also complete
the required lower-division
pre-nursing requirements if
these required courses were not
completed with their previous
studies.

Accelerated students begin with our general pre-licensure BSN students and take an additional class each semester of the first year. After successfully completing the first year of study, accelerated program students begin a summer session of study and continue in the fall completing their studies in December.

Accelerated Program Admission

Students with a baccalaureate degree from an accredited college or university may apply for the accelerated program. Application decisions begin November 15 of the year prior to enrolling. While applications are accepted throughout the year, applicants are encouraged to apply early due to the competitiveness of the program.

Criteria for Provisional Acceptance

Applicants must have a previously completed baccalaureate degree in another field of study. All applicants must have at least 30 credit hours of lower division pre-nursing requirements complete to be considered for admission. Consideration for provisional acceptance is based on the following required documents:

- Completed application accompanied by a \$60 non-refundable application fee.
- Submission of a legal document showing proof of name at time of application (state-issued photo ID).
- 3. Applicants are required to complete the ATI Test of Essential Academic Skills (ATI TEAS) with a minimum score of proficient.
- 4. Official transcripts at the end of each term from all regionally accredited college(s) attended showing:
 - a. A minimum of 30 semester hours of designated lower division transferable college credit with a cumulative GPA of 2.75/4.0.
 - b. A minimum grade of C in all required courses. All science courses are recommended to be completed within the last five years prior to enrollment in St. John's College. Anatomy and physiology I & II must be taken at the same institution.
 - c. No designated lower division course may be repeated more than once.
 - d. Official transcripts must come from the granting institution directly to St. John's College. Hand-carried transcripts are not acceptable.
- 5. Personal interview as requested by the college.
- 6. Two professional references.
- 7. Personal essay.
- 8. Good academic standing in the last institution attended.
- All applicants with English as a second language are required to take the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) and achieve a score of 560 on the paper version, 220 on the computer-based version or 83 on the internetbased (iBT) version.

Admission Requirements

- 1. Completed application accompanied by a \$60 non-refundable application fee.
- Graduation from an accredited diploma or associate degree nursing program (must have a cumulative GPA of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale in lower division general education courses.)
- 3. RN with an unencumbered license.
- 4. Good academic standing at the last institution attended.
- 5. Completion of 57 semester hours of prenursing curriculum with a cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale.
- 6. Official transcripts from all regionally accredited college(s) attended showing:
 - a. A minimum of C in all required lower division general education courses.
 - b. No designated lower division course may be repeated more than once. Official transcripts must come from the granting institution directly to St. John's College. Hand-carried transcripts are not acceptable.
- 7. Provide two professional references.
- 8. Submission of a legal document showing proof of name at time of application (state-issued photo ID).
- 9. All applicants with English as a second language are required to take the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) and achieve a score of 560 on the paper version, 220 on the computer-based version or 83 on the internet-based (iBT) version.



MASTERS OF SCIENCE IN NURSING

St. John's College graduate program offers a master's of science in nursing for BSN graduates who wish to pursue advanced practice nursing in either a nursing administration and leadership or family nurse practitioner role.

The master's program of study consists of five core courses of online learning with student requested face-to-face meetings. After completion of core courses (15 credit hours), the RN student continues to a specialty track of family nurse practitioner or nursing administration and leadership.

Nursing Administration and Leadership

The online nursing administration and leadership track with practicum experience is for nurses who wish to increase their business and communication skills and relationship building in a health care environment. The hybrid family nurse practitioner track is for nurses who wish to become an advanced practice nurse (APN) who can treat health conditions with a focus on disease prevention and health management. Students wishing to earn a doctor of nursing practice (DNP) may apply to our dual admission program with University of St. Francis. Contact the college or visit sics.edu for details.

Family Nurse Practitioner

The family nurse practitioner track has a combination of face-to-face and online learning. The nursing administration and leadership track is completely online with student requested face-to-face meetings.

Criteria for Provisional Acceptance

Consideration for provisional acceptance is based on the following requirements:

- Completed application accompanied by a \$60 non-refundable application fee.
- Submission of a legal document showing proof of name and Illinois residence at time of application (state-issued photo ID).
- Submission of official transcripts from all regionally accredited college(s) attended showing:
 - a. Cumulative GPA of 3.0/4.0 in upper division BSN courses.
 - b. Good academic standing in the last institution attended.
 - c. Proof of completion of bachelor's degree in nursing from a regionally accredited and State Board of Education-approved college. Official transcripts must come from the granting institution directly to St. John's College. Hand-carried transcripts are not acceptable.
- Completion of a nursing baccalaureate degree within the last five years, or if BSN received more than five years ago, the applicant must have practiced as an RN within the last two years.
- 5. Active and unencumbered registered nurse license in the State of Illinois.
- 6. Two professional letters of reference.
- Personal essay (approximately 250 words describing professional career aspirations in advanced practice nursing).
- 8. Professional resume.
- Ability to use computer technologies including accessing, retrieving, receiving and communicating information.
- Submit official transcripts showing proof of completion of a graduate statistics course within the last five years with a grade of B or higher.

Upon notice of formal admission and to receive permission to enroll in classes, the student must:

- 1. Complete a pre-entrance health examination and provide proof of up-to-date immunizations.
- 2. Complete a criminal background check with no disqualifying conditions.
- 3. Undergo a drug screening.
- 4. Undergo a personal interview as requested by the college.
- 5. Provide proof of CPR certification (within last year).
- 6. Provide proof of medical insurance.
- 7. Provide proof of malpractice insurance.

Applicants are expected to exemplify good character enabling them to actively seek the moral, intellectual and professional growth described in the mission statement of the college.



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
